ORDINANCE NO. 206

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP WASHINGTON OF **ESTABLISHING** PENALTY FOR NON-COMPLIANCE AND/OR VIOLATION OF NOT OBTAINING PERMITS AS REQUIRED BY VARIOUS **ORDINANCES** OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON, REGULATIONS AND RESOLUTIONS AS ADOPTED FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Washington Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: The short title of this Ordinance is known as the No-Permit Penalty Ordinance.

Section 2: The word "person" as used in this Ordinance shall mean any natural person, association, partnership, firm or corporation.

Section 3: The definitions as set forth in the Ordinances, Regulations and Resolutions, as adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Washington Township, are incorporated by reference herein, as though set forth at length herein.

Section 4: Any person who shall fail to comply with the provisions of the Ordinances, Regulations or Resolutions of the Township of Washington regarding the attainment of required permits as referenced therein shall, upon

application for the required permit(s), be required to pay Three Hundred (300%) Percent of the original permit fee to the Township of Washington Zoning & Codes Officer.

Section 5: All other Ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

Section 6: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon enactment.
